



Vessel delays update - Auckland

09th March 2021

Dear Valued Customer,

Please find below updates on vessel delays through Auckland.

Capitaine Dampier V179 has loaded part of her export cargo but has been instructed to vacate the berth and organise further hull cleaning. She is expected to re-berth on the Thursday 11th March morning.

Capitaine Tasman V46 is currently in Auckland working. Due to severe congestion at the Ports of Auckland, she must load cargo for Fiji and planned for transshipment through Fiji that was booked for the Capitaine Dampier V179. This is required to make space on the port to receive cargo booked for the Capitaine Tasman and Southern Trader. Capitaine Dampier V179, when she returns to berth, will then be loading much of the Fiji bound cargo originally booked for the Capitaine Tasman V46.

Southern Tiare V33 will complete her dry docking on the 11th March and we expect a berth to be available on the 12th March to commence cargo operations.

Southern Trader V488 is currently awaiting a working berth in Auckland and we expect her to commence cargo operations on the 13th March. We will be advising receiving dates for her once we have this confirmed with the port.

Our Customer Services team will be working with you to re-organise bookings on the Capitaine Dampier and Capitaine Tasman that may be affected by the requirement to create space on the wharf to receive cargo.

These delays will be reflected in this week's schedules.
